

## STARTING THE YEAR

Hesston College kicked off the 2018-19 year during Opening Weekend, Aug. 17 to 19, and the first day of classes Aug. 20. Enrollment for the year is 420 students from 28 U.S. states and territories and 20 countries. With an institution-wide focus on broadening global engagement, diversity at Hesston is on the rise. The international student number of 56 held steady from 2017, but the countries students call home grew by three in 2018. Hesston is committed to being an institution that welcomes students from all backgrounds and beliefs. As a college of Mennonite Church USA, nearly 21 percent of students come from the Anabaptist-Mennonite Christian faith tradition, and more than 30 other Christian denominations and world religions comprise the campus community.



## GLOBAL ENGAGEMENT A PRIORITY FOR THE NEW YEAR

The arrival of President Dr. Joseph A. Manickam a year ago also brought a renewed campus commitment to global engagement. “Being globally engaged is unquestionably what it means to be faithful followers of Jesus, and that’s what we are at Hesston College,” said Manickam. “We can’t sit unto ourselves, in our own bubble. Hesston College has something to offer the world, and we are being beckoned to engage widely. It’s the missional mandate of following Jesus.” Initiatives in place to increase the college’s global reach and transcultural opportunities for all students include:



- Mackenzie Miller, a 2018 graduate, is participating in a global experience pilot program. She is spending the year in China through a partnership with Mennonite Partners in China that is allowing her to study Mandarin at Nanjing Normal University, serve with a local organization and experience a new culture.

- The development of an Intensive English Language Program, which would allow the college to offer more services and support for English Language learners coming to Hesston. The program is planned to launch in fall 2019.

- On-campus roles that focus on creating transcultural opportunities for all students.

Hesston College celebrated Homecoming 2018: A Celebration of 60 Years of Lark Intercollegiate Athletics Sept. 27 to 30. More than 500 campus guests enjoyed events including class reunions, recognitions of distinguished alumni athletes and coaches, a recognition of nurses who are joint alumni of Hesston College and Kansas City General Hospital School of Nursing, the Hesston College Golf Benefit, the Manickam Mosey annual run/walk, a kids’ festival and headlining entertainment by bluegrass group, The Steel Wheels.
