NOTES FROM THE MUSIC DIRECTOR

Composer Gian Carlo Menotti wrote the following about Amahl and the Night Visitors:

"This is an opera for children because it tries to recapture my own childhood. You see, when I was a Child, I lived in Italy, and in Italy we have no Santa Claus. I suppose that Santa Claus is much too busy with American children to be able to handle Italian children as well. Our gifts were brought to us by the Three Kings, instead."

Menotti drew on his childhood memories to create this beloved opera, which to me has always captured the essence of what Christmas is really all about. As you watch this performance, reflect on these words sung between the kings and Amahl's mother and the profound message of the image of Christ found in an impoverished little boy:

Have you seen a Child the color of wheat, the color of dawn? His eyes are mild, His hands are those of a King, as King he was born. Incense, myrrh, and gold we bring to His side, And the Eastern Star is our guide.

Have you seen a Child the color of earth, the color of thorn? His eyes are sad, His hands are those of the poor, as poor He was born. Incense, myrrh, and gold we bring to His side, And the Eastern Star is our guide.

Yes, I know a child...The child I know on his palm holds my heart. He's my child, my son, my darling, my own, and his name is Amahl.
