

INTERIM PRESIDENT

The Hesston College Board of Directors and Mennonite Education Agency Board have appointed Benjamin E. (Ben) Sprunger as interim president starting August 1. His appointment comes as President Howard Keim transitions out of the role after an 11-1/2 year tenure. Dr. Sprunger's past roles include six years as president of Bluffton (Ohio) College (now University)(1972-78) and nine years as president and CEO of Mennonite Economic Development Associates, Inc., (MEDA) (1994-2003). The Presidential Search Committee reported that the search for Hesston's ninth president is proceeding as scheduled. Sprunger's interim arrangement is to last at least through Dec. 31, 2016, and no longer than June 30, 2017, to allow adequate transition time for the college's next president.

RN TO BSN



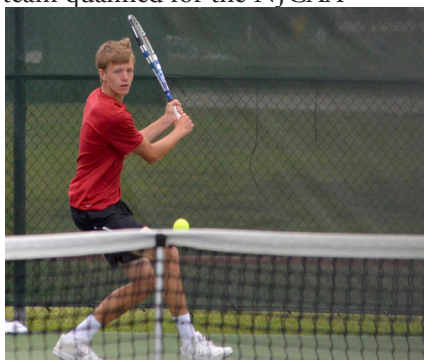
Starting in January 2017, Hesston College will launch an RN to BSN program for registered nurses looking to complete a bachelor's level degree. The associate degree program (ADN) expanded in August 2015 to include a four-year bachelor of science in nursing (BSN) program. The RN to BSN program will be offered with full-time, one-year or a part-time, two-year options. Courses will

be a hybrid of online and on-campus as a way to promote the balance of work, school and family life for students. The program will also be offered at a special two-year RN to BSN tuition rate with the price locked for a student's duration in the program. LARK ATHLETICS FIND POST-SEASON SUCCESS

For the second year in a row, the Men's Tennis team qualified for the NJCAA Division I National Tournament in Plano, Texas, May 16 to 20. The Larks finished 17th of 24 teams. Singles players and doubles teams competed well, with the doubles team of freshman Riley Kingsley (North Newton, Kan.) and sophomore Keegan LeFevre (Woodland Park, Colo.) advancing to the consolation bracket final match.

The Baseball team captured the 2016 NJCAA Division II Region VI title to advance to the district level in Lee's Summit, Mo., May 19, before dropping games to Western Oklahoma State College (Altus) and Metropolitan Community College-Longview (Lee's Summit). The Larks finished the season with a 21-36 record.



INTERNATIONAL CHORALE

Following Commencement, 26 students and three music faculty members departed on a three-week European tour of the Netherlands, Germany and Switzerland through May 30. They performed several concerts in churches as well as learning European history and the history of Mennonites in Europe.

CONGREGATIONAL STUDENT AID

Hesston College offers a match grant for scholarships provided by students' churches. During the 2015-16 year, 65 churches contributed \$176,880 in student scholarships to 108 recipients. Hesston College matched a total of \$112,885. The average church aid per student was \$1,637 while the average church-and-college aid per student was \$2,683.
